

Yannis Yannitsiotis is Assistant Professor (tenured) of Social History at the Department of Social Anthropology and History, University of the Aegean. He also teaches at the Postgraduate Program on Public History of the Hellenic Open University. He studied History at the University of Athens, and he pursued post-graduate studies (DEA) at the University of Pantheon-Sorbonne I, in Social and Economic History of Europe (19th-20th centuries). He received his PhD from the University of Athens in 2001. He has written the monograph *The social history of Piraeus. The making of the middle class, 1860-1910* (in Greek, Nefeli, 2006) and the study *History and Business* (in Greek, Ant. Sakkoulas Publications, 1994). He is the co-editor of the collective volumes *Rhetorics of Work*, Pisa University Press, 2008, *Contested places in the city* (in Greek, Alexandria, 2010) and *Masculinities: Representations, subjectivities and practices from Middle Age to contemporary period* (in Greek, Gutenberg, 2019). He has published articles in collective volumes and journals in Greek, English and French. His research interests concern urban history, gender history and public history.
