He is an acting member of the governing boards of the EU Fundamental Rights Agency, of the Aegean Institute on the Law of the Sea and Maritime Law, of the Hellenic Society of International Law and International Relations and of the Centre for Pontic Studies. He is also an expert (CIMIC) in humanitarian law for NATO Rapid Deployable Corps (NRDC-GR).

He is co-editor to the monograph Series on International Studies of Sakkoulas Publications and his latest book is: *The Principle of Non-Intervention/Non-Interference among States: Limits and Contemporary Challenges in the International Legal Order* (Athens-Thessaloniki: Sakkoulas Publications, 2020), while he also co-edited the *Liber Amicorum* for Emeritus Professor C.
