The study hours for each learning activity as well as the hours of selfdirected study are given following the principles of the ECTS.

- In the case of group theses, one main supervisor is responsible for the whole group
- Submit interim versions of the thesis, at regular intervals, to the thesis study portal.
- After submitting their completed report, it is corrected by two professors
- Acceptance of the final report is followed by a final presentation
