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She is an Assistant Professor of Substantive Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure at the Law School of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. She teaches European Criminal Law at the Hellenic Open University and has taught the same subject at the Greek National School for the Judiciary (2017-2025) and the Open University of Cyprus (2024-2026). She has taught undergraduate courses of Substantive Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure and Penitentiary Law at the Law Schools of the Democritus University of Thrace and AUTH as well as the Hellenic Open University. She has participated in several national and European research projects, including LMUExcellent, AGIS and Hercules projects, on the criminal liability of politicians, human trafficking, terrorism, mediation procedures, conflicts of jurisdiction, etc. She has received scholarships by the State Scholarships Foundation of Greece, EDBM34, DAAD, ISISC and the Papagiannopoulou Bequest. Since 2017 she works as a national expert with the European Commission on evaluating the Greek transposition of EU law. She is the Greek contact point of the European Criminal Law Network and a member of the Research Institute for Transparency, Corruption and Financial Crime.
