Dr. Christina Marabea is an archaeologist, specializing in Prehistoric Archaeology and actively participating in land and ‘amphibious’ excavation fields since 1997 (in the Saronic Gulf, the Ionian Sea and the Peloponnese), at sites dating from the end of the Neolithic era (4th millennium BC) to the Early Byzantine era (6th/7th century AD). Since 2010 she has been Assistant Director of the University Excavations in Salamis, while in the years 2014-2015 she directed the excavation at the Mycenaean tholos tomb of Kampos Avia, Messenia, under the auspices of the Archaeological Society at Athens. As part of her research activities, she has participated in projects for the protection and promotion of archaeological monuments and sites and has gained long experience in training students in the archaeological field and the workroom.

She has participated in national and European interdisciplinary research projects related to various periods of Aegean prehistory and history and has received grants for her research programmes from Greek and foreign institutions. During the years 2016-2021, she taught, as an Adjunct Lecturer, courses in Prehistoric Archaeology and Excavation Methodology at the Department of History and Archaeology of the University of Ioannina and, among others, curated the first organization of the Teaching Collection at the Museum of Casts of the Faculty of Philosophy. Since October 2026 he has been a member (SEP) in the Postgraduate Programme ‘Documentation and Modelling of Monuments and Archaeological Sites’ (ATM) of the School of Applied Arts and Sustainable Design of the Hellenic Open University. Since 2017 she has been co-editing the publication of the review *Enalia*, a scientific journal of the Hellenic Institute of Marine Archaeology.

She is a member of the Archaeological Society at Athens, the Hellenic Institute of Marine Archaeology and the Board of Directors of the Society for the Promotion of Salaminian Monuments ‘Akamas’. In addition to her doctoral dissertation, her published scientific work includes: two monographs, a handbook on excavation methodology, co-editing of several scientific volumes and more than 40 articles in Greek and foreign journals, honorary volumes, conference proceedings, excavation reports, etc.

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
