This Thematic Unit (ThU) will be carried out through the writing of an individual original thesis during the 4th semester on topics related to the content of the postgraduate programme in order to cultivate, develop and evaluate the analytical and critical skills developed by the students during the programme.

The design of the thesis, the research, the collection of literature, and analysis will be carried out by each student individually under the supervision of a supervisor.
